The Men's Advice Line is a confidential, freephone helpline for male victims of domestic violence (in heterosexual or same-sex relationships). Our focus is to increase the safety and minimise the risk to men experiencing domestic violence.



We do this by:

- Giving men a chance to talk about their experiences
- Using a non-judgmental approach
- Providing emotional support and practical advice
- Focussing on safety-planning and reducing risk
- Exploring solutions that are focussed on the needs of the callers
- Signposting to a range of services, including organisations offering legal advice, housing advice, counselling, advocacy, one-two-one support etc.

The Men's Advice Line also supports professionals working with male victims of domestic violence.

We offer:

- Information and advice on work with male victims via our helpline, email and website
- A Toolkit on work with male victims of domestic violence
- Training courses for anyone interested in working with male victims.
